Electronic signature - Manual

A. In case of signing an application by a domestic company, by a representative with an electronic identity card.

- **1.** Download the template that was duly completed in IRREQ to your computer.
- 2. Complete it with all required additional data.
- **3.** Save your application in PDF format AND in Word format.
- **4.** Insert your electronic identity card into the card reader of your computer.
- **5.** Open the PDF document.
- 6. For the actual signing, see the following website :

<u>Attention</u>: there are several certificates available, choose the one with your name followed by "(Signature)" and with a validity date that is still valid. Choose the option "Lock document after signing".

B. In case of signing an application by a foreign company, by an authorised representative with or without an electronic identity card.

Foreign companies can also submit an application with a qualified electronic signature, which is the equivalent of a manual signature.

- In case the application is submitted from a European country where citizens have an electronic identity card (which is recognised as a 'qualified device' - QSCD) with a qualified certificate for electronic signature, the application can be signed in accordance with the procedure described above under A.
- 2. In case the application is submitted from a European country where citizens do not have an electronic identity card with a qualified certificate for electronic signature, the necessary certificates must be purchased. A qualified certificate is an electronic confirmation which links the signature verification data to a natural or legal person and confirms the identity of that person.

The certificate can be purchased from a qualified trust service provider in Europe listed on the European Commission's joint list "TL Browser".

With such a qualified certificate delivered to you on a data carrier, you can then sign any PDF document in accordance with the procedure mentioned under A. The qualified certificate must be delivered with a QSCD to comply with the 3rd condition for qualified electronic signature.

Attention: Every electronic signature can be tested for validity via the Digital Signature Service of the European Union.
